Inclement Weather Update

The Board's Inclement Weather policy has been updated. Two important pieces for Horizon families:

- Windchill is the measure used to determine Yellow or Red Days due to cold temperatures (no more ambient temperature measure).
- The temperature used to determine when Horizon busses will be cancelled is aligned with the rest of the Division. Busses will not run when the temperature with windchill is at or below -40 celcius.

We hope these changes will make it easier for families to have transportation to school on chillier days. However, as always, if you have a concern about your child riding the bus on a colder day, you can absolutely make a choice about bus transportation based on your comfort level.

Horizon Parent Society Annual General Meeting February 16th 7-8pm Horizon School

The Annual General Meeting for Horizon's Parent Society is coming up! The Parent Society is a Non-Profit Society registered under the Province of Alberta. They have strong fundraising structures in place - the main one being a Casino every couple of years. This allows them to keep the time demands for Board members low. Meetings only need to be held every 2-3 months, and they are kept to less than hour.

The Parent Society needs to increase its membership in order to maintain their Society status, which allows them to continue working casinos, which allows Horizon students and families to continue to have costs covered for activities like swimming and music therapy!

The Parent Society requires the following Board positions:

President (VACANT) A 'figurehead' role. Attends meetings. Votes on motions.

Vice President (VACANT) Another 'figurehead'. Attends meeting. Votes on motions.

Treasurer (FILLED) This role involves the bulk of the work the Society undertakes. They complete annual returns (Society, AGLC, Charitable Status), hold signing authority, complete general accounting, and currently act as the Casino Chair.

Secretary (FILLED) This person takes minutes of meetings and sends them out to Board members

Members at large (VACANT) Attend meetings, vote on motions.

The Parent Society understands that the demands on Horizon families outside of school are great, and they strive to make the time commitment very small. It's also important to note that members of the Society do not actually need to be parents of a student. All they need to have is an interest in supporting the special needs of the students who attend Horizon! If this isn't a commitment you can make, spread the word to friends, families, members of your church, etc.
