I have a Bachelor's Degree in Child and Youth Studies and close to 15 years experience working with vulnerable youth in various roles. I'm at Horizon every Wednesday for the entire day and I love connecting with the students while I'm here!

The focus of the Family School Wellness program is to provide support for students who are facing emotional difficulties while at school. Together with students and parents, Family School Wellness can support information and referrals, student and/or family support, 1:1 short term support to students and parents, groups aimed at student growth, and help for families seeking external agency support. The FSW program is a voluntary program which requires parental/guardian consent for 1:1 support. We value and seek parental involvement and work as part of a multidisciplinary school team to provide school based support for children and families.

As we look forward to Winter break in a few short weeks, may the weather hold out just a little longer so we can enjoy all of the outdoor activities that have been taking place!






